New PSHE curriculum

- Requirement to teach new Relationships and Health Education objectives statutory from September 2020
- Our curriculum is based on the programme of study from the PSHE Association which covers statutory objectives and more
- Updated resources and content
- ▶ Long Term Plan sets out spiral curriculum by year group and term:
 - Autumn: Relationships
 - Spring: Living in the Wider World
 - Summer: Health and Wellbeing
 - ► However, many objectives overlap!
- Medium Term Plan sets out objectives (statutory in **bold**) and suggested resources. There are 3 topics per term for each theme.

Consultation

PSHE planning and resources

- ► There is more content to cover and so we recommend a weekly slot in order to cover objectives thoroughly
- ▶ PSHE should be taught by teachers due to the nature of the content
- Use MTP as a guide and then plan individual lessons using PSHE planning proforma
- Suggested resources range from 1Decision, to written lesson plans from organisations such as NSPCC, to Bitesize videos
- It is really important that you review these suggestions and design lessons and activities to suit your children
- You may find other useful resources great! But make sure these are not already allocated to another year group.
- ► Ensure LOs are measurable (not 'to understand', but 'to explain' or 'to describe')


